Jenn Clifford introduced the Math Task Force our guest speakers. The task force has been together for just over 2 years. They are a group of teachers district wide with representation from each grade who work closely with Christine Fischera our district match specialist. They have been looking at the curriculum to see that it aligns with the common core. Through teacher development and workshops they have enhanced our curriculum to more closely align with the new standards.

Melissa Graham presented a sample of 5th grade math work and how kids are working together to solve problems using diagrams, visual pictures to solve complex multi step problems

Allison Goodchild presented a sample of what they are doing in Kindergarten counting "bears in a cave." Her curriculum consists of many different math games and teaches the basics of problem solving and addition and subtraction.

Mary Adamik presented the 1st grade math standards and how kids learn from "not yet" problems in which they learn from mistakes. The focus is more on the thought process behind solving problems. Teaching children to be problem solvers as opposed to rote memorization of facts.
